As you may already be aware, new GCSE records were set against every measure this summer, including the number of A/A* grades, the 68.4% of students gaining at least 5 A*- C grades including English and Maths and the 99% of students who passed at least 5 subjects at GCSE. The overall points score achieved by students was also our best ever. St Richard Gwyn was one of the top two performing schools in Flintshire against all the key measures.

We had excellent results in the Sixth Form with a more than 98% pass rate at A Level. All students passed the Level 3 threshold measure of at least two A Level passes and all got into their chosen university. In addition, our Year 9 students achieved school record end of Key Stage 3 results in June. Congratulations to all our students. They fully deserved their success.

We are a warm welcoming Catholic school, and welcome students from all backgrounds. We would like the opportunity to demonstrate what we as a school can offer your child if they become part of our family and join us here at SRG. We are striving for excellence in everything we do and our aim is to remain one of the top performing schools in Flintshire.
