### Italy Tour 2018 Taith Yr Eidal 2018

Over half term 34 students and 4 staff travelled to Italy for what would be a fantastic experience where they would learn about the geography, history, art, language and culture of all that Rome and Sorrento had to offer.

Flying into Rome you could sense the excitement and nerves of our students. and arriving to a beautiful sunset just added to the mix. It's not often you fly into a city and see a sight like the Vatican out of the window.

Our first day was all about Rome - the Colosseum was spectacular, huge in size, it was hard to imagine that 80,000 Romans would have once packed the arena to watch gladiators fight. Our tour continued and we headed through the Roman Forum, Palatine Hill and onto the Piazza Venezia. We were in awe of everything we passed and Guia, our excellent tour guide, talked away into

our headphones. The afternoon was just great with a visit to the Trevi Fountains, Spanish Steps (or should that be French), Piazza Navona and the architectural masterpiece, Pantheon. We stood inside and the gravity-defying dome room is enormous, it literally defies the laws of physics!

Tuesday saw the tour arrive in the Vatican City. The city state is home to the Pope, as well as some of the greatest masterpieces of all time. We were guided round and left speechless at the art work, scared to move at times in case our bags collided with a priceless piece. As we walked down the corridors the anticipation built; we were about to enter the Sistine Chapel. As we walked in, we felt the atmosphere change, the hairs stood up on the back of our necks, we knew we were somewhere incredibly special. We all gazed up at Michelangelo's frescoed ceiling and were in wonder at the scale, the precision and the varying sections which all had their own special story behind them. Bellissimo!



On to Sorrento we headed out to find gelato, and it did not disappoint. Every flavour you could imagine - and what an order....38 large cones later we strolled around taking in the peace of this famous coastal town. As we woke on Wednesday you could sense the nerves...we would be walking up Mount Vesuvius, the towering volcano, which in a single eruption could devastate millions of people's lives in the Naples region.

The walk up Vesuvius was tough going. Steep in nature it gave wonderful views down onto the urban area below. The sun was shining as we walked around the crater. The volcano that is left, is only a 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the size of the original which caused such devastation nearly 2000 years ago. As we began our journey down the weather turned, but not the rain we had expected, it began to snow! By the time we reached out coach the National Park was closing itself down, for

fear of people becoming stuck. This gave us a very unique experience.

In the afternoon, we headed to Pompeii. The vast archaeological site was once a thriving and sophisticated Roman city, but in 79 A.D., Pompeii was buried under meters of ash and pumice after the catastrophic eruption of Mount Vesuvius. The eerie streets and casts of the bodies which had been found in excavation really did hit home.

That evening we walked into Sorrento for the last time before returning to our hotel for a tour presentation. The students had been true stars, they had listened everywhere we had been, asked intelligent questions and really got into the spirit of our tour. As I explained on the night, it was a pleasure to have visited Italy with them. Thank you to everyone involved, and especially to Mr Crawley, Mrs Jones and Miss Amos. Another year, another completed tour...the big question left to answer though, where next?

### **ELECTION OF PARENT/CARER GOVERNORS – VACANCY NOTICE**


