Pope John Paul II initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The Pope himself had been diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before, in 1991, and it is considered that his own illness was impetus for his designation of the day.

World Day of the Sick, was first observed on February 11, 1993. February 11 is also the Catholic Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, which a name is given to the Virgin Mary in honour of the apparitions that in and around Lourdes, France, by a young girl called Bernadette Soubirous. The Church canonized Bernadette as a Saint several years later.

Shakespeare Festival ~ Gwŷl Shakespeare







Headteacher's Message

I write to you at the end of a particularly special fortnight in which it has been my privilege to observe over fifty members of the teaching staff working first hand in their classrooms to lead our students in their learning and in securing their progress and attainment. This has been a fascinating and crucial opportunity to follow students around, predominantly those in Year 9, whose important Option choices are soon ahead of them. It has been delightful to witness the hard work of all staff including admin, technicians, teaching assistants and students and the outstanding interpersonal relationships which colour and characterise all their transactions in their classrooms, and which are bound together in prayer, which is integrated into every lesson.

Particular aspects of students learning which I was looking to establish and clarify was that students are really clear about their learning targets and their current progress towards those targets, and - on top of these elements - being aware of what they need to do further to reach their targets. This has been resoundingly demonstrated in nearly all the classrooms which I visited. I found all the students very willing and able to chat about their work and the direction in which they are clearly heading. The sharing of targets has been an important feature of our work in this half term, and is absolutely definitely proving a great motivator for the vast majority of students who care about their learning progress and becoming the best that they can be.

It has also been pleasing to note that more and more students are beginning to respond closely and specifically to the **feedback** teachers give them in class and with homework, going back over their work and improving it - both in terms of their knowledge and understanding, and also their all important literacy and numeracy skills. You can be very reassured as parents and carers that students have every opportunity and encouragement to be clear about where they are heading, know how to retrace their steps and improve their prospects, and put themselves in the best position for academic success.

Across the fortnight, standards of attendance have shown signs of an upward trend, which is so very important. I thank you for your support both in matters of attendance and in general as we strive for excellence in everything we do here at St Richard Gwyn it does. We have an important visit from Estyn in the coming week, which finishes on Thursday, when the Year 9 Parents Evening will be held.

Please keep all in the St Richard Gwyn community in your prayers. Thank you.
